- Matthew 12:18 -- "Behold, My Servant whom I have chosen; My Beloved in whom My <u>soul</u> is well pleased; I will put My Spirit upon Him, And He shall proclaim justice to the Gentiles."
- Luke 1:46-47 -- "And Mary said: 'My <u>soul</u> exalts the Lord, And my spirit (πνεῦμα) has rejoiced in God my Savior."
- Acts 2:27 -- "Because Thou wilt not abandon my <u>soul</u> to Hades, Nor allow Thy Holy One to undergo decay.'
- Acts 14:22 -- "strengthening the <u>souls</u> of the disciples, encouraging them to continue in their faith, and saying, 'Through many tribulations we must enter the kingdom of God.' "
- I Peter 2:11 -- "Beloved, I urge you as aliens and strangers to abstain from fleshly lusts, which wage war against the <u>soul</u>."
- Revelation 16:3 -- "And the second angel poured out his bowl into the sea, and it became like that of a dead man; and every <u>living thing</u> in the sea died."
- John 12:27 -- "Now My <u>soul</u> has become troubled; and what shall I say, 'Father, save Me from this hour?' But for this purpose I came to this hour" (Note John 13:21 -- "When Jesus had said this, He became troubled in spirit" (πνεῦμα)
- Matthew 20:28 -- "Just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His <u>life</u> as a ransom for many." (Note Matthew 27:50 -- "And Jesus cried out again with a loud voice, and yielded up His spirit" (πνεῦμα)
- Matthew 22:37 -- "And He said to him, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your <u>soul</u> and with all your mind."
- c. "Spirit" (**II)** in the Old Testament
- Genesis 41:8 -- "Now it came about in the morning that his <u>spirit</u> was troubled, so he sent and called for all the magicians of Egypt, and all Its wise men. And Pharaoh told them his dreams, but there was no one who could interpret them to Pharaoh."
- Deuteronomy 2:30 -- "But Sihon king of Heshbon was not willing for us to pass through his land; for the Lord your God hardened his <u>spirit</u> and made his heart obstinate, in order to deliver him into your hand, as he is today.'
- I Chronicles 5:26 -- "So the God of Israel stirred up the <u>spirit</u> of Pul, king of Assyria, even the <u>spirit</u> of Tiglath-pilneser king of Assyria, and he carried them away into exile, namely the Reubenites, the Gadites, and the half tribe of Manasseh, and brought them to Halah, Habor, Hara, and to the river of Gozan, to this day."
