The bylaws of a local church are rules which specify <u>how</u> the affairs of the church are to be conducted. They stipulate how the responsibilities and duties of the members, officers, and boards and agencies are to be carried out, and how the various organizations within the church are to function. In organizational theory, bylaws specify processes and procedures.

Bylaws usually include such articles as the following:

- I. Meetings
- II. Election of Officers
- III. Board(s)
- IV. Church Committees
- V. Church Organizations
- VI. Rules of Order
- VII. Amendment

    - (2) Training and probation of members
    - (3) Election and ordination of members
    - (4) Term of office of members
    - (5) Dismissal from office of members
