NOTE: Does this mean that the gospel will be proclaimed in all the world in such a way that all nations will hear it once dur- ing their history, or in such a way that all nations will hear it during a period of a lifetime or a generation? Does this mean that Christ cannot return until this proclamation is completed? The answers to these questions are very important, since they are relevant to the formulation of a global strategy in allo- cating human and material resources to the task of worild evangelism and missions.
